# Areas of Concern

## HOUSING

*I believe we must:*

- Prioritise those on housing lists the longest, as well as those in emergency accommodation.
- Ensure planning permission is easier to obtain.
- Prioritise the construction of purpose-built student and assisted living accommodation.
- Ban vulture funds.
- Further increase tax credits for renters and mortgage holders.
- Reform the HAP scheme and purchase social housing, where possible, to secure long-term tenancies.
- Increase the supply of affordable homes through local authority schemes (e.g. Local Authority Affordable Purchase Scheme).
- Ensure more public land is suitably zoned and utilised.

## IMMIGRATION

*I will propose:*

- A nationwide conversation and referenda on key immigration issues.
- Tackling corruption and profiteering within the “asylum industry”.
- Introducing more effective border controls and security checks.
- Fast-tracking asylum claims (which often take years).
- Scrapping the “self-deportation” policy for serious criminals and those abusing the system.
- Refusing entry to those who destroy documentation.
- Exploring alternative solutions to the migration “crisis”.

## HEALTH

*I will advocate for:*

- Tackling the GP shortage (e.g. increasing undergraduate training placements).
- Lifting the HSE moratorium on hiring Irish healthcare workers.
- Major investment in mental health and vital services.
- A community-based approach to care, such as respite and special needs support.
- An independent inquiry into the recent unprecedented rise in excess mortality.

## INFRASTRUCTURE

*To boost development in the west, I back:*

- Major infrastructure investments to enhance tourism and stimulate industrial expansion around Knock Airport.
- Extending the Western Rail Corridor to serve Galway, Mayo, and Sligo while establishing a connection to Knock Airport.
- Introduce a public / community banking system, while utilising Apple Tax revenue to create a state-owned investment bank focused on economic development.

## ADDITIONAL PRIORITIES

*I also stand for:*

- Remove race / gender ideology and age-inappropriate sexual content from school curricula.
- Ensure access to education for special needs children and reduce childcare costs.
- Tackle the cost of living by reducing carbon taxes and enforcing competition laws to combat price-fixing cartels.
- Stricter public oversight of government spending (e.g. €6.2 billion annual spend on NGOs).
- Reduce council rates and VAT to support SMEs.
- Address root causes of crime and ensure provision of more Gardaí with an emphasis on community policing.
- Create incentives to bring the Irish diaspora home and help our young people stay.
- Maintain Ireland’s enshrined neutrality.
- Reclaim our oil and gas and decouple our farming and fishing industries from EU policy.
- Appoint a dedicated animal welfare officer for Mayo.
